When they discussed their aspiration to become a B-Corp with sustainability innovators from the University of Surrey, they suggested a Knowledge Transfer Partnership might be a solution!

Matched with a Chemistry Masters student

They were matched with a Chemistry Masters student, who used their scientific expertise to complete a Life Cycle Assessment of their business's carbon footprint.

A quick win!

Through this research, they discovered that they could halve the carbon footprint of their packaging by switching from glass bottles to cans. They're currently in the process of making this swap across their full range!

What about low-alcohol beer?

For Morgan and Elaine, this research also pointed towards an exciting new market opportunity for their business. Their novel brewing process might allow them to brew naturally low-alcohol beer, while diverting an even larger volume of bread from food waste. In fact, they're looking to use another KTP to answer this question!
